Twain Butler is an Associate Professor and a Research Forage Agronomist within the Forage Improvement Division at the Samuel Roberts Noble Foundation. He holds adjunct faculty appointments at Texas A&M University, Tarleton State University, and Oklahoma State University. He received his Bachelors degree in Agronomy-Crop Production from Texas Tech University, Masters of Science Degree in Agronomy-Weed Control from Oklahoma State University, and Doctorate degree in Agronomy-Forage Physiology from Texas A&M University. He worked four years as the regional Forage Extension Specialist at the Texas A&M Research and Extension Center located in Stephenville, TX. In 2004, Twain joined the Noble Foundation, where his research interest focus on the establishment and production management of forage cultivars that are being developed by the Forage Improvements Division's Forage Breeders. He has published over 27 refereed journal articles in the areas of legume evaluations, weed control, forage establishment, soil fertility, and evaluation of forage systems under grazing.
